



Dag 1. Saturday. Day 1. Take a short trip (1-2 hour 15 nm) to Hyppeln. Nice island known as the Mackerel paradise, this island is located the northern part of the Gothenburg archipelago. Here you can walk on the trail along the water and get an unbeatable view of the sea. Look at sunset and have a nice Saturday evening in the safe harbour on the east side. Take the opportunity to visit the "giant head" which is a high steep hill where you get a nice view of the Carlsten Fortress on Marstrand. Hyppeln have a restaurant in the harbour. If you want party and pubs- sail directly to Marstrand. Takes 1.5 hour (+9 nm) from Hyppeln.

Marstrand - the sailing metropolis of the west coast
The picturesque and beautiful island is a yearly base for the Marstrand Regatta, Match Cup Sweden and other major sailing championships. A large guest harbour, excellent shops and exciting nightlife and entertainment for the entire family.

In the far west, where the archipelago ends and the open sea begins, you find the island of Marstrand with Carlsten Fortress at the top. The sailing town and seaside resort Marstrand is a favourite with visitors. It is home to a harbour filled with all kinds of boats, cosy homes along car-free streets, top restaurants and cafés, sun and salty swims, music and spectacle.. If you want to take it easy or if its to many boats there- go to the nice island Åstol. Takes about 40 min. You enter the harbour on the east side. Dag 2. Visit Käringön. Trip about 16 nm from Marstrand. 25 nm if you start from Hyppeln. Narrow streets with white wooden houses, bustling piers and swimming from smooth rocks. Käringön is a wonderful, traffic-free island in the Bohuslän archipelago that gives its visitors seaside calm and memorable experiences. Petersons Krog is located at Käringön, an island just outside the west coast. They serve classic Swedish dishes with a modern touch. +46304-560 19 if you want to booking table.

Chose green line if you want to sail inside the archipelago. Some distans longer, but you will have nice nature view. Take a brake in Kyrkesund or Mollösund

Dag 3. Next night harbour Smögen. About 20 nm. On the way you can visit Lysekil. A bigger town with the things you need. 10 nm from Käringön. Another seaside star, Smögen sports a buzzing waterside boardwalk, rows of rickety fishermen's houses, and steep steps leading up into a labyrinth of lovingly restored cottages and pretty summer gardens.

Day 4. Sailing up to Grebbestad. 24 nm

Grebbestad has the largest population in the area and is a great place to visit all year round.

The beautiful jetty, in connection to the lively guest harbour creates a great atmosphere and adds character to Grebbestad. We offer restaurants, outdoor seating and activities for people of all ages.

The guest harbour in Grebbestad offers around 200 spots for boats and the harbour is open almost all year round. The harbour has a lot to offer for families as well as a great selection of pubs and clubs for those who prefer the nightlife. You will have access to water, electricity, showers and toilets. Washing machines can also be booked. The port office is located in the middle of the guest harbour. We have many activities and offers from taxi boats to deliveries of sandwiches, pastries and other things. You can also order the morning newspaper and have it delivered to your boat. Now you can also get Wi-Fi in the guest harbour.

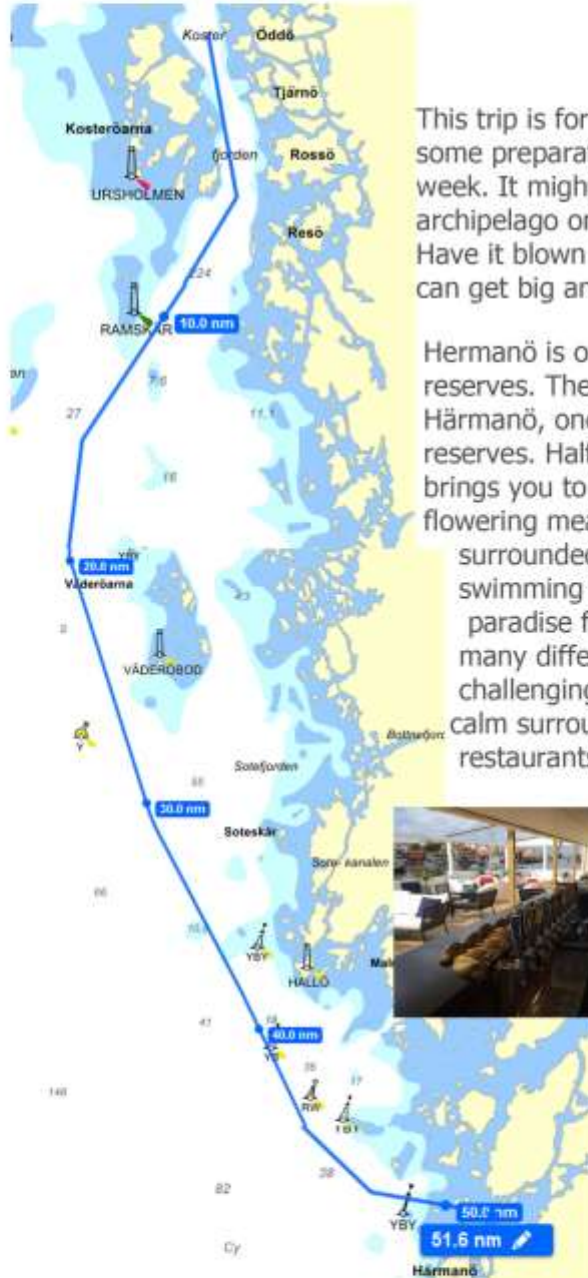
Welcome to Strömstad

Day 6. Prepare for a long sea sailing back to Gothenburg. Bounce on good winds. Sail down to Gullholmen outside the archipelago.

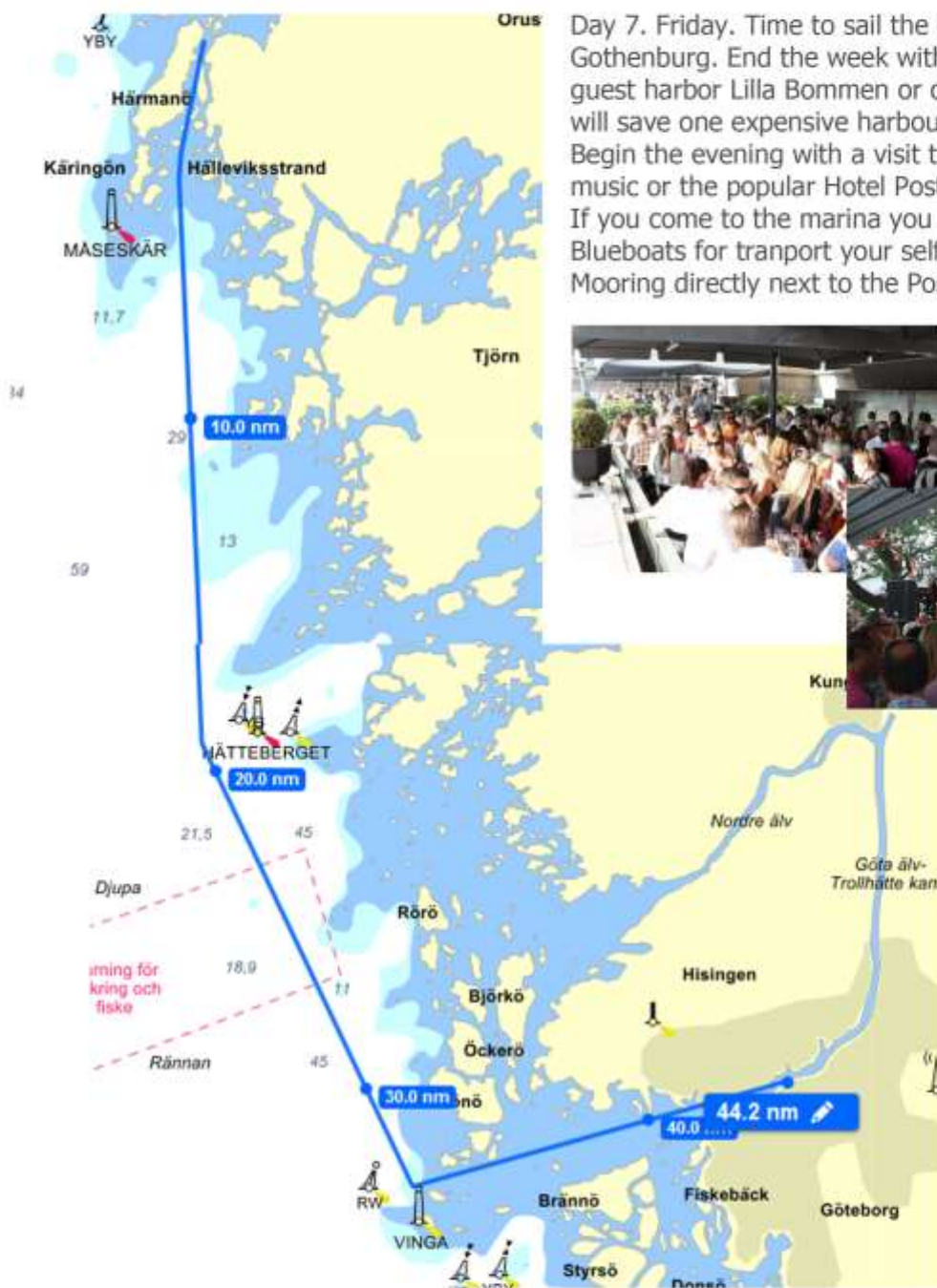


This trip is for those who like to sail. Requires some preparation. Verify winds for the whole week. It might be better to sail outside the archipelago on the way up. Have it blown a lot of days before the waves can get big and some of your staff get sea sick.

Hermanö is one of Bohuslän's largest nature reserves. The other half of the town is on Härmanö, one of Bohuslän's largest nature reserves. Half-hour's walk south on Härmanö brings you to a recreational setting with heaths, flowering meadows and pasture land surrounded by clean cut forest areas and swimming coves. The island is a real paradise for bird watchers and there are many different footpaths, easy and challenging, where you can really enjoy the calm surroundings. You will find good restaurants etc.

Day 7. Friday. Time to sail the last stage down to Gothenburg. End the week with a whole night in Göteborg's guest harbor Lilla Bommen or come to our marina and you will save one expensive harbour fee. Begin the evening with a visit to the Grillstugan with live music or the popular Hotel Post. If you come to the marina you can rent one of our Blueboats for transport your self in to Göteborg channels. Mooring directly next to the Post hotel or Grillstugan.

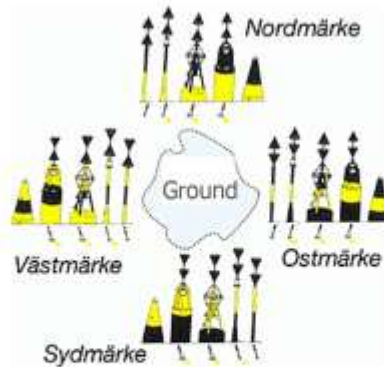
